Dental exams	Every 6-12 months starting at age 3					
Vision screens	3y, 4y, 5y, 6y					
<b>Screenings</b>						
Height and weight	During each exam					
Blood pressure	3y, 4y, 5y, 6y					
Hearing screen	Birth, 1y, 4y, 5y, 6y					
Lead poisoning	Between 6-12 months; and 24 months					
Autism screen	At 2 years old					
Anemia screen	9-12m and 15-18m, high risk may need more screenings					
Tuberculin skin test	Those at high risk					
High cholesterol	High risk after age 2					
Urinalysis	5 years					
<b>Immunizations</b>						
DTaP (Diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis)	2m, 4m, 6m, 15-18m, 4-6 years					
Hepatitis A	12m, 18m					
Hepatitis B	NB, 2m, 6-18m					
Hib	2m, 4m, 6m, 12-15m					
IPV (polio)	2m, 4m, 6-18m, 4-6 years					
Influenza	Every year after 6 months, the first year will require 2 doses 30 days apart					
Meningococcal	High-risk patients between 2-10 years old					
MMR	12 – 15m and 4-6 years					
Pneumococcal	2m, 4m, 6m, and 12-15m					
Rotavirus	2m, 4m, 6m or 2m, 4m					
Varicella	12-18m and 4-6 years					
DTaP (Diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis), IPV – inactivated polio; MMR – Measles, mumps and rubella; varicella – chickenpox; rota – rotavirus
